THE MANDENI AREA IS HOME TO SEVERAL TOURIST

ATTRACTIONS THAT ARE RICH IN HISTORY.





The Thukela River is the main river running through the KwaZulu-Natal province. It flows from the Drakensberg range, winding through beautiful plains before meeting the Indian Ocean at Tugela Beach.

The Ultimatum Tree

In December 1878, the British government in South Africa issued an ultimatum to King Cetshwayo's senior representatives, demanding the disbandment of the Zulu army and allegiance to Queen Victoria. The Zulus' refusal led to the Anglo-Zulu War a month later. This significant event took place near the Thukela River. While the original tree marking the spot has died, a branch from it was used to plant a new tree, which is now enclosed and fenced.

British Warriors Grave Site

Overlooking the Thukela River and Tugela Beach is Fort Pearson, a former British fortification built before the 1879 Anglo-Zulu War. It served as the headquarters for colonial troops and is now a grave site for British soldiers, including Charles Lucas Lyle and Arthur T. Reynold. Visitors wishing to access the grave site should contact the Harold Johnson Nature Reserve, managed by Ezemvelo KZN Wildlife.

Emkhontweni (Ingwavu Heritage Site)

The Ingwavu area is historically significant as the site where King Cetshwayo's troops spied on Prince Mbuyazi's forces. The area includes the entrance to the cave used for surveillance. An important feature is Isihlahla somkhonto, a tree with a spear embedded

by herbalist Manembe Gcwensa, believed to weaken Prince Mbuyazi's faction. The Amaziko were used by troops as fireplaces.

Ndulinde Hills and Waterfalls

Known as the homestead of the late Queen Nandi Mhlongo, the Ndulinde Hills and Waterfalls offer stunning natural beauty and a connection to Zulu heritage.

The Battle of Indondakusuka

Two significant battles took place on the slopes of Indondakusuka. In 1838, settlers from Port Natal clashed with Dingaan's forces. In 1856, King Mpande's sons, Cetshwayo and Mbuyazwe, fought over the Zulu throne, with Cetshwayo emerging victorious.
